

Wollondilly Shire Council has refreshed its vision for the future with a set of plans encompassing the community's long-term aspirations and priorities; building on the significant progress made over the last term and presenting a strategic response to the opportunities and challenges ahead.

Following a period of community consultation, Council has adopted the high-level Community Strategic Plan – Wollondilly 2040, along with supporting documents that outline resourcing and implementation including the Delivery Program, Operational Plan and Budget.

With community priorities in mind, Council has committed to an ongoing massive investment into roads and infrastructure assets across the Shire, including a record \$217.6 million Capital Works Program over the next four years.

We look forward to delivering significant road projects such as asphalt reconstruction works on Montpelier Drive at Mowbray Park and Menangle Road at Douglas Park, a new bridge at Brownlow Hill Loop Road and extensive heavy patching and resurfacing work throughout our 900km+ road network.

Major infrastructure projects will include the implementation of the Bargo Sportsground Master Plan and exciting upgrades to Thirlmere Memorial Park; while new and improved public amenities, footpaths and cycleways will be appearing right across the Shire.

We are already working towards the delivery of new and upgraded community halls at Thirlmere, Oakdale and The Oaks, a new playground at Redbank Reserve, south of Picton and improvements at Telopea Park, Buxton. We have just opened some exciting new park facilities for families at Appin.



Wollondilly Shire Council is continuing our commitment to stronger, safer and more connected communities through the 2025/26 Capital Works Program, with a major focus on road improvements and footpath construction. This year's program also includes road resurfacing, drainage, and kerb and gutter works right across the Shire.

Key projects include road reconstruction at Remembrance Driveway, Bargo (recently completed), Montpelier Drive, Mowbray Park and Menangle Road, Douglas Park, plus footpath and drainage works in Yanderra, Buxton, Thirlmere, and Silverdale. Railside Avenue in Bargo will also be revitalised with formalised parking, drainage and pathways.

SHIRE Signage ROLLING OUT.

The multi-year rollout of Wollondilly's updated Shire entry and town/village signage has begun, with the fresh new signs now in place at Thirlmere, Buxton, Warragamba, Wallacia, and Douglas Park.

You will soon see the signs on some of the main entry roads into the Shire, such as Picton Road and at either end of Appin Road.

After extensive community consultation and a trial of the design, last year Council resolved to adopt the style and preferred wording of the new signage to replace a range of ageing and mismatched historical signs. The new signs aim to better reflect Wollondilly's identity and cultural heritage and improve clarity and consistency across the Shire with the inclusion of Council's current logo, colours and branding.

We'll be rolling out the new signage over the coming years. We're also pleased to now have new sets of bright matching banners hanging in the main streets of many of our local towns and villages.





OPEN DAYS

The Robin Davies Community Nursery grows a variety of native plants, from grasses and groundcovers to shrubs, vines and shade trees. The next Robin Davies Community Nursery open days are 27 September and Saturday 29 November, 8am - 12pm.

Wollondilly residents are entitled to five free local native plants a quarter from our nursery. An open day is a great opportunity to come and meet the team and stock up on your free plants.

WOODBRIDGE ROAD

TEMPORARILY CLOSED

Woodbridge Road, Menangle will soon be temporarily closed for approximately 12 weeks while a significant drainage reconstruction project is undertaken. Further details will be available soon and variable message boards will be on site with closure dates as they become available.

DILLY WANDERER

The Dilly Wanderer is a free mobile community information service that provides child development activities and interactive learning and play to families as it visits towns and villages across the Shire, funded by the Department of Communities and Justice.

To trial some upcoming changes, the Dilly Wanderer will operate on a month to month schedule until the end of 2025. A brand-new calendar is planned for release in the new year!

During the winter months (June, July, August) activities will run from 10am to 12pm, while for the rest of the year, hours will be 9am to 11am.

We are also trialling changes to some of our stop locations (Oakdale and Menangle) to align with the existing Mobile Library schedule, while locations with consistently low attendance may be swapped out. These changes will help us to explore new areas and visit our most popular sites more often.
