*Items must be less than 1.8m in length and in rolls









Metal

*Metal items must be less than 1.8m







Household Goods/ Loose Items*

Toys, Prams, Clothing, Linen, Crockery, Boxes, Bicycles, Sporting Equipment

*Loose items must be in boxes or bags







Electronics*

Televisions, Computers, Kettles, Heaters, Lamps, Fans

*Items must not contain any glass

Dear Resident.

Wollondilly Shire Council offers **two scheduled household clean-up collections** each year to assist with the disposal of bulky waste and scrap metal items for residential properties paying for a domestic waste service.

HOW TO USE THE CLEAN UP COLLECTION SERVICE

Placing waste materials for collection:

- Items must be placed out in a neat and tidy manner on the kerb, secure loose items in bundles or boxes and avoid footpaths, mailboxes and driveways. Make sure materials are easily and safely accessible for collection staff
- Place out items no earlier than 48 HOURS before your collection is due to start (Placing out items early can be treated as illegal dumping and may attract a fine)
- Place items directly in front of your property unless otherwise advised by Council
- Avoid placing materials under trees, low power lines or other overhead obstructions
- Do not park vehicles in front of your pile
- Materials cannot be placed out after the collection has started in your area, as vehicles will not return
- Please place all recyclable items including metal items and e-waste to the side so these items can be easily spotted and recycled.

Important collection safety tips:

- Only approved waste items will be removed as part your collection - please refer to accepted items list ('Please check the "Right" and "Wrong" lists on the back of this flyer)
- Household waste items must be less than
 1.8 metres in length and able to be safely lifted by two people. Oversized items will not be collected
- Ensure fridges or freezers are completely empty and remove any doors or locks.

How much can I put out for collection?

- Limit per collection: 1.5 cubic metres per rateable property
- Over-presentation of waste will result in removal of the 1.5m³ allowance only. Any excess waste must be returned to private property immediately as illegal dumping penalties may apply to waste not returned to private property.
